


1 The Bismarck Tower in Burg




The 27-meter-high observation tower on the legendary Schlossberg, a pre- and protohistoric rampart, was built between 1915 and 1917. It offers a wide view of the Spreewald landscape and as a landmark of Burg, it is a popular excursion destination. The unique setting of the Schlossberg, and in front of a charming and natural scenery, extraordinary events take place such as the „ Spreewald Night of Fables“ and the „Night of the Pumpkin Spirits“ with impressive light and pyrotechnic displays. (Open daily from April to October, 10 am to 6 pm).

8 Altmarkt with the Pharmacy Museum



Once the main market place and originally surrounded with half-timbered houses, the Altmarkt today is an impressive ensemble of Saxon-baroque town houses and 18th-/19th-century traditional eaved buildings. The Pharmacy Museum, housed in the 400-year-old Löwenapotheke, features pharmacy fittings from the 19th and 20th centuries, herb and poison chambers and medicine cellars.

Hermann Prince of Pückler-Muskau (1785-1871) created a landscape park in Branitz based on the English model. The sea pyramid, the tumulus, is the prince's burial place. The late Baroque castle, with its partially original interior, offers a largely authentic impression of royal life. The restored salons and oriental rooms are among the highlights of aristocratic culture.

29 Play and relax in Lübbenau's „Spreewaldreich“



The farmstead from 1818 is a vivid depiction of life in the countryside: The authentically furnished residence with farm house, the barns with agricultural tools and the collection of tractors, as well as the herb garden and baker's oven give visitors an ensemble to feel good and linger. The entire area covers some 5.000 m² and includes an old linden tree in the inner yard.

2 Schlossberghof in Burg




Visitors to the Schlossberghof farm can experience nature with all their senses. Here, Spreewald herbs and crops are cultivated in the herb garden and sold in the farm shop. The information centre includes an interactive exhibition on the Spreewald Biosphere Reserve, and you can test all your senses at the barrier-free „Nature Experience Clock“. It is also possible to visit the „Annenmarie Schulz House“, a typical Spreewald farmhouse from 1726, and next door is the Weidenburg „Arena Salix.“

9 Cottbus Memorial Prison




The Centre for Human Rights Cottbus runs the memorial prison, which was formerly the largest and most notorious political prison in East Germany. The exhibition entitled “Checked clouds: Political imprisonment in the Cottbus prison 1933 – 1989“ shows typical examples of political injustice from the time of the Nazi reign of terror and the Communist dictatorship period, including reconstructed cells from different decades.

The Museum of local history in Dissen presents an exciting exhibition on the lifestyles of Sorbian/Wendish farmers. Highlights include the local traditions and the diverse variations of the Sorbian traditional dress. Legends provide insights into the mystique of the Spreewald region. At the museum „Stary lud – the ancient folk“, you can literally grasp 1400 years of history. Eight to thirteen stork nests and many signs show the rearing of the young. In the area of the Spreaue, the beginning of the Spreewald is symbolized according to legend with the sculpture of the devil and the oxen.

10 Mill Island and the Brandenburg State Museum of Modern Art



On the Mühleninsel (Mill Island), which originally emerged from an artificial canal below the Schlossberg, today stands, among other things, the State Museum of Modern Art. It houses the largest collection of art from the former East Germany (DDR) and subsequent artistic traditions. The building was constructed in 1927/28 as a diesel power plant.

Fürstlich Drehna is first mentioned in documents dating from 1477. Fürstlich Drehna is a moated castle, and was originally a mediaeval fortress that was expanded into the current four-wing building after 1560. The park was laid out from 1807 onwards under P.J. Lenne. Expanded in 1877, in 1984 it was partially destroyed by lignite opencast mining. Today, old and new have been successfully merged to create a horticultural show-piece.

24 Spreewald Biosphere Reserve




South-east of Berlin is a unique landscape in Central Europe – the UNESCO Spreewald Biosphere Reserve. The Spreewald is unique due to its park-like landscape which is criss-crossed by numerous rivers and streams. The Spreewald is a habitat that is rich in flora and fauna. In 1990 it was declared a biosphere reserve, and in 1991 was awarded UNESCO status.

The historic ironworks on the Peitz ponds is a national technical monument. The blast furnace hall and the partially functional foundry are unique. The fishing museum tells the story of inland fishing and pond management. There is also an exhibition on the Peitz smelting works, a mineral and fossil exhibition and the traveling exhibition „Woodstock at the carp pond - free jazz in the DDR.“ With VR glasses, the art of forging can be experienced virtually - as if you were there at the aluminum show casting. Calau is the birthplace of the „Kalauer“ or „pun“, as in the 19th century the shoemakers who worked here used to churn out jokes and delight in the ambiguity of words. These puns were then spread worldwide, thanks to Ernst Dohm, who published them in his satirical newspaper „Kladde-ratsch“. As a result, the term „Kalauer“ established itself in the German language as the word for „pun“ and remains in use today. The Calauer Schusterjungen (Calau Cobbler Boys) invite you to explore the city in the footsteps of the former shoemakers.

The impressive inlet structure for flooding, the viewing tower in Merzdorf as well as picnic spots and lookout points are already attracting visitors. Some 128 million cubic metres of water will fill the lake by the time it is ready for use.

From 1492 onwards, Luckau was one of the capitals of Lower Lusatia (Niederlausitz). The city impresses with its lovingly restored old town and spacious gardens and parks created for the 2000 State Horticultural Show. The historical centre is fully surrounded by the 1,800-metre long moat and the almost fully intact city wall. The George Chapel, the neoclassical town hall, buildings with magnificent renaissance gables, and the Nikolai Church all bear witness to the city's eventful history documented in the Niederlausitz Museum.

32 Peitz Fortress Tower – the oldest building in the fishing and fortress town of Peitz




The impressive fortress tower in the historic old town has walls up to six metres thick and massive barrel vaults. This was the main building in the old castle complex and later the general tower in the fortress of Hans von Küstrin. Today, it is home to a museum featuring the history of the fortress. A multimedia exhibition complete with talking figures and an interactive table reveals how the fortress in Peitz was constructed, while the banquetting hall is used for concerts, weddings and other celebrations. You can even venture up the baroque turrets for spectacular views from a height of around 35 metres. Tip: Learn interesting facts and anecdotes about the construction of the fortress with an audio guide.

39 Calauer Schweiz Observation tower



Those who climb the 216 steps of the 43-metre-high stone viewing tower in Calauer Schweiz are rewarded with a panoramic view of the nature reserve and the region. The previous wooden building had to be demolished. The landmark of Calauer Schweiz, which was completed in 2020, can be reached via a well-developed network of cycling and hiking trails from Calau and Altdöbern. The Plinsdörfer villages of Gosda, Zwietow and Weißag are situated in the south. The villages are known for their "Plinsen", a kind of pancake made from buckwheat flour, which is still offered in local restaurants today.

Towers, gates and guard houses reveal the layout of the old town. The Münz Tower and the Spremberger Tower delimit the 1,200-meter-long section of the old fortification. The Spremberg Tower, the city's landmark, was built in the 13th century and, together with the bastion and the gatehouse, forms the southern gate. The pinnacle crown was added in 1823-25 according to plans by Schinkel. The Spremberg Tower is 31 metres high and is open to visitors.



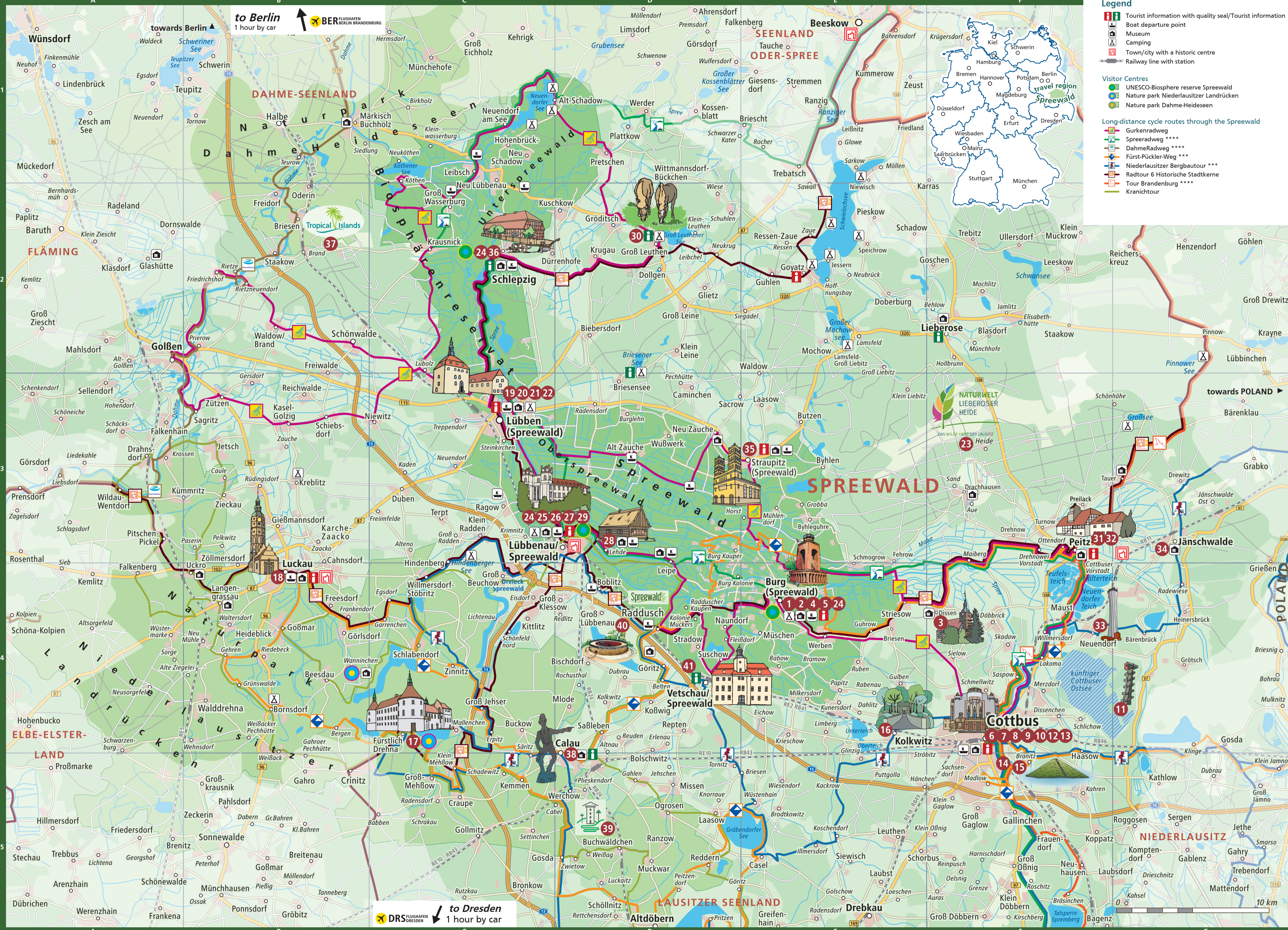


14 Cottbus Zoo
