historic farms from different regions of the Spreewald. Visitors can take a look inside originally decorated farmhouses, see a family bed that really was big enough for an entire family, learn fascinating details about historic crafts, or call in at the oldest punt-maker in the Spreewald

In the hands-on areas in the open-air museum, the entire family can try their hand at old-fashioned chores that used to be part of everyday life, including washing sheets at the washbasin using soap and a washboard. In the cowshed, town and city children can have a go at milking, or walking in wooden clogs. Skippingropes and stilts were popular 100 years ago, and the hay-bed is the perfect place for a lie-down.
